2. Admission Requirements

You must have TOEIC L&R 700 points or above, TOEFL (iBT) 75 points or above, or equivalent English level and must be female and meet one of the following requirements:

- Graduated 4-year university or college in Japan.
- Earned a degree according to Article 68(2-3) of the School Education Law of Japan.
- Successfully completed at least 3 years at Osaka Jogakuin University, Department of International & English Interdisciplinary Studies Course and are recommended by Osaka Jogakuin University with excellent results and adequate number of credits.
- Have at least two years of experience at a Japanese or foreign organization that is related to international issues and/or human rights. Also, this person needs the equivalent level of learning from a four-year undergraduate institution as assessed by Osaka Jogakuin University Graduate School.
- Successfully completed 16-year school education program abroad.
- Designated by the Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology of Japan.

NOTES:

- Even if you do not have a qualification of graduation from a four-year college or university, such as you graduated a two-year college, a technical college, or a special training college, we may admit the applicant if you are assessed as having the equivalent level of learning from a four-year undergraduate institution. Osaka Jogakuin University Graduate School will assess the qualifications of the applicant if you are 22 years old or older and meet the requirement d) above.
- We may admit the applicant of age 22 years old or older when you are assessed as having the equivalent level of learning from a four-year undergraduate institution even if you do not meet the requirement d) above because of the education system in your home country.

(1) Application Form (Fixed form)

- An applicant must fill out the form by black ballpoint pen.
- When making a correction, the applicant should draw double lines through mistakes and sign on the line.
- Fill the form in English.

(2) Research Plan (See page 5)

- 2,000 words in English
- In principle, use a typewriter, or a PC.

(3) Letter of Recommendation (Must be sealed)

- In Japanese or English, only.
- Items below should be included;
 - Relationship between the applicant and the recommender
 - Name, occupation, and institution / organization of the recommender
 - Signature of the recommender

(4) Curriculum vitae and related information (Fixed form page 2)

- Only if you have work experience

(5) Copy of your Official English proficiency exam score or certificate to prove your English level

- TOIEC L&R 700 or above • TOEFL (iBT) 75 or above
- You have to bring and show the original on the exam date upon request.

(6) Transcript from undergraduate and graduate educational institution attended (Must be sealed)

(7) Certificate of graduation or Certificate of expected graduation

- Should be authorized by the college or university the applicant graduated

(8) Defraying Expenses Plan (Fixed form) (Admission from abroad only) (International students only)

(9) A Copy of Passport (ID pages, only) (Admission from abroad only) (International students only)

- A copy should be included an applicant's photo.

(10) Visa to Japan (Need copy of all pages) (International student who stays in Japan only)

(11) A copy of Registration Card issued by the mayor of city, town, village or special district (International student who stays in Japan only)

(12) Certification of funding by Japanese government for foreign students (International student at government expense only)

13. Special Requests

Preparing a Research Plan

One key part of the application process is your research plan, and we expect you to prepare it.

Please use the following format for the research plan. It should be about a 4-page plan (about 2000 words in English) and typed.

Introduction: Why do you want to do this research?

Short literature review: Some key past research including citations.

Research questions: Your possible research question or questions.

Methods: How might you do the research (interviews, surveys, observations, document analysis, etc.)?

Possible significance: Why is this research important?

References: What are some of your sources? (Use a format you are used to, such as APA, Chicago, and MLA.)

Your possible 2-year study plan: How do you think you will be spending your 2 years during the master's program? Write about each semester (such as reading on the topic, doing interviews, analyzing, etc.)
