AAP Special Program

Admission Policy

- **Knowledge and Understanding:** Academic knowledge and skills at a bachelor degree level appropriate for advanced research on environmentally friendly and sustainable agriculture, forestry, fisheries and sciences to solve the essential issues related to the student's home country.
- **Thinking, Judgment and Implementation:** The basic ability to identify and theoretically address the issues in agriculture, forestry, fisheries, and related industries to solve those essential issues.
- **Interest, Motivation and Attitude:** The ability to actively works to solve the above issues ethically through independent thinking in cooperation with others.
- **Skills, Expression and Explanation:** Basic communication and presentation skills to explain one's reasoning, judgment and achievement to others.

Curriculum Policy

- "Introductory Subjects/Elective Subjects" provide basic knowledge on environmentally friendly and sustainable agriculture, forestry and fisheries for food production and basic techniques for presentation. Besides, the subjects include language education for basic conversational expressions and sentence structures essential for daily life in Japan*.

*All students are required to take a Survival Japanese class after entering the program and students may take other optional Japanese language and culture classes.

- "Research Subjects" promotes the abilities to plan and execute research, and to debate and make presentations.
- "Practical Subjects" offer students a chance to gain experience in practical field-work for gaining work experience in Japanese companies, understanding the regional characteristics of the Shikoku area as an academic research field, and understanding the culture of Japan and Japanese communities in the Shikoku area.
- "Specialized Subjects" provide a broad and high level of advanced knowledge on environmentally friendly food production through a curriculum that is developed by each student corresponding to own needs.

- The "Master's Thesis" leads to the ability to understand advanced knowledge and to acquire experimental techniques as well as to develop logical and system thinking.
- Evaluation is comprehensively performed based on “Knowledge and Understanding “, “Theoretical Thinking, Judgment and Implementation”, “Interest, Motivation and Attitude” and “Skills, Expression and Explanation” acquired in the process of describing the Master’s thesis.

Diploma Policy

- **Knowledge and Understanding:** Acquire comprehensive knowledge and understanding of technology concerning environmentally friendly and sustainable agriculture, forestry, fisheries and sciences, and certain knowledge of Japanese economy, industry, culture and tradition.

The Shikoku Education Consortium for Special Course from Asia, Africa and the Pacific Rim (SECAAP) has been established under an integrated concept shared by the three graduate schools of agriculture of Ehime, Kagawa and Kochi Universities, in Shikoku, Japan. The SECAAP offers a Special Course for students from Asian, African, and Pacific Rim countries (Agricultural Science DX Leader Program in Asia and Pacific Asia Region) (Special Course). The program and application procedures are outlined below.

1. PROGRAM GOALS

The purpose of this program is to cultivate advanced specialists equipped with the practical competencies necessary to address the diverse challenges faced by regional communities in the Pacific Asia area. This is achieved through an interdisciplinary educational program delivered by a broad range of faculty members, enabling students to acquire knowledge and technologies in smart agriculture and sixth-sector industrialization, grounded in the agricultural and related research developed by the three universities participating in this special course.

2. ACADEMIC PLAN

- (1) The special course is a five-year continuous education program composed of master's and doctoral courses. After completion of all the requirements in the master's course (two years), students will be awarded a master's degree from the university where they conducted studies. (The requirements include 30 credits from the special course curriculum, an approved master's thesis, and a passing grade on the final examination.) Students may continue their studies in the doctoral course (three years) of the United Graduate School of Agricultural Sciences, Ehime University (UGAS) after screening at UGAS. Students will be awarded doctoral degrees after completion of all requirements. (The requirements include earning more than 12 credits, approval of their doctoral dissertation, and passing the final examination.) Furthermore, students who would like to enroll in only the first two-year master's course may apply for the special course.
- (2) This system enables students to create a curriculum that corresponds to their needs. With the guidance of academic advisors, students may select from over 130 classes to develop their own unique program.
- (3) All classes and research instruction are conducted in English. However, all students are required to take a 'Survival Japanese' class after entering the program, and students may take other Japanese language classes.

3. FIELD OF STUDY

Applicants should choose a field of study related to that of their prospective academic adviser with reference to the attached list of prospective advisors, research fields, and research topics. Applicants are required to consult with their prospective academic advisor about the field of study before applying to the program.

5. JAPANESE GOVERNMENT (MEXT) SCHOLARSHIP University Recommendation/Special Selection

※ Applicants should carefully review the Japanese Government (MEXT) Scholarship for 2026 Research Students/Undergraduate Students (University Recommendation) [Special Selection] Application Guidelines as well.

5-1. Qualifications and Conditions

(1) Eligibility: International students with outstanding academic achievements who enter Japan as new students or those already staying in Japan, and who satisfy one of the following requirements:

- 1) Have graduated or will graduate from a Japanese university or have academic ability equal to or superior to that of a university graduate.
- 2) Have completed or will complete a 16-year school curriculum in a foreign country.
- 3) Have completed a 15-year school curriculum in a foreign country and have been recognized by SECAAP to have obtained the prescribed units with first-class honors.

(2) Citizenship: Applicants must be citizens of countries in Asia, Africa, or the Pacific Rim (including the Russian Federation) that maintain diplomatic relations with the Government of Japan, and must not possess Japanese nationality. However, five of the six positions available shall be selected from Southeast Asia (ASEAN), a priority region under this program.

(3) Age: Applicants must be under 35 years old as of April 1, 2026 (born on or after April 2, 1991).

(4) Health: Applicants must be sufficiently physically and mentally healthy to pursue study at the university.

(5) Grades: Applicants must have earned an academic performance coefficient of 2.30 or above in their degreed (for those who are employed) or currently enrolled courses.

- (6) Language Proficiency: Applicants must be proficient in English. (CEFR: B2 level or above)
- (7) Arrival in Japan: Applicant must be able to arrive in Japan between September 17 and September 30, 2026.
- (8) Visa Requirement: If selected, applicants will be required to newly obtain a “Student” visa and enter Japan with the residence status of “Student.”
- (9) Non-Eligibility: Those who meet any one of the following conditions are ineligible.
- ① Those who are military personnel or military civilian employees at the time of their arrival in Japan or during the period of the payment of the scholarship;
 - ② Those who cannot arrive in Japan by the date specified by MEXT or the accepting university;
 - ③ Those who are previous grantees of Japanese Government (MEXT) Scholarship programs (including those who withdraw from the scholarship program after acquisition of student status). However, this does not apply to those who wish to apply for Research Students program and meet any one of the following conditions. In addition, since the Monbukagakusho Honors Scholarship for Privately-Financed International Students does not apply to the Japanese Government (MEXT) Scholarship programs, the previous grantees can apply.
 - those who have at least three years of educational or work experience following the end of the payment of the previous scholarship and the start of this scholarship;
 - the past grantees of Japanese Studies Students program who have graduated or are going to graduate from universities in their home countries, the Japan-Korea Joint Government Scholarship Program for the Students in Science and Engineering Departments, and the Young Leaders’ Program.
 - those who have obtained or are expected to obtain a degree as undergraduate students of the Japanese Government (MEXT) Scholarship programs (university recommendation/special selection).
 - ④ Those who are currently also applying to another program under the Japanese Government (MEXT) Scholarship system. This includes the programs for which scholarship payments will begin in FY2026;
 - ⑤ Those who are planning to receive scholarships or fellowships from the Japanese government, Japanese government-related organizations, and others after the start of the scholarship payment period;
 - ⑥ Those who are expected to graduate at the time of application and cannot satisfy the condition of academic background by the deadline given;
 - ⑦ Holders of dual nationality at the time of application who cannot verify that they will give up Japanese nationality by the time of arrival in Japan (the acquisition of student status);
 - ⑧ Those who plan to, from the time of application for the MEXT scholarship program, engage in long-term research (such as fieldwork or internship) outside Japan or plan to take a long-term leave of absence from the university;
 - ⑨ Those who have no intention to obtain a degree.

5-2. Scholarship Benefits

- (1) Allowance: 144,000 yen per month
 (the amount may be subject to change due to the situation of the Japanese Government’s budget.)
 Period of scholarship: the necessary period for the completion of the respective regular master’s course.
 (2 years)
- (2) School Fees: All school fees, i.e., entrance examination, registration, and tuition, shall be exempted.
- (3) Traveling expenses
- 1) Transportation to Japan: MEXT will provide an economy-class airline ticket for the flight from the international airport closest to the grantee’s residence (in principle, the country of nationality) to an international airport in Japan used on the normal route to the accepting university.

2) Transportation from Japan: MEXT will provide an economy-class airline ticket to grantees who are scheduled to graduate or complete their program and return to their home country by the end of the final month of the scholarship period, covering travel from the international airport in Japan normally used for the accepting university to the international airport (in principle, in the country of nationality) nearest to the grantee's residence.

Note1: The grantee shall bear at his/her own expense all costs related to domestic travel from the grantee's residence to the nearest international airport, airport taxes, airport usage fees, special taxes necessary for travel, travel expenses within Japan (including airline transit costs), travel insurance expenses, carry-on luggage or unaccompanied baggage expenses, etc.

5-3. Application Procedure

Applicants must select one of the three universities and submit the following documents to the Dean of the Graduate School by January 26, 2026. All documents should be sent through the head of the institution with which the applicant is affiliated.

- (1) Application form: (2026 MEXT Form).
- (2) Field of study and Research plan (2026 MEXT Form).
- (3) A copy of the certificate of graduation (undergraduate school, and graduate school if applicable) issued by the university authority, or an official form indicating that the applicant is expected to graduate, and the date of expected graduation
- (4) A copy of the applicant's academic record (undergraduate school and graduate school) issued by the university authority, indicating a GPA or other evaluation method enabling calculation of an academic performance coefficient.
If possible, a document issued by the undergraduate school attended, indicating the applicant's academic record, including his/her class standing, i.e., within the top 5% of the class.
- (5) A copy of the applicant's passport (If you do not have a passport, we accept a certificate of citizenship issued by municipal or appropriate authorities.
- (6) Three 4.5×3.5 cm photographs taken within 6 months of submission of the application: hatless, showing the full face and upper torso, applicant's name and citizenship written on the reverse side. One photograph must be pasted to the application form as indicated.
- (7) An abstract of the applicant's graduation thesis or equivalent (less than 5 pages, A4 size). If applicants are not required by their university to write a graduation thesis, this should be explained. Any publications should be submitted.
- (8) The original or certified copy of the results of an internationally recognized English language proficiency test, such as TOEFL, TOEIC, or IELTS.
※Applicants who have completed an educational program that satisfies the admission requirements with English as the primary language of instruction shall submit a certificate issued by their home institution confirming that English was the primary language of instruction.
- (9) A letter of recommendation from the dean (or higher authority) at the applicant's current university or other institutions, addressed to the president of the accepting university.
- (10) A letter of recommendation from the applicant's supervisor or equivalent, regarding the applicant's ability and career. English language proficiency should also include an evaluation of the applicant's English language proficiency, ranked as "excellent" or "good" (use the provided form).
- (11) A letter of recommendation from an individual who has conducted research with the prospective academic advisor. If no such person is available, this letter is not required.

(12) A record of contact with the prospective academic advisor, which indicates the applicant's choice of academic advisor (use the provided form).

Note 1: All applicants are required to be in close contact with the prospective academic advisor of their choice, and the research proposal must be prepared in consultation with the prospective advisor.

Note 2: For documents not written in English or Japanese, an official English translation of the certificate must be submitted.

Note 3: Applicants must take interviews with their preferred primary advisor and other faculty members. (Interviews may be conducted online.)

Note 4: All forms should be typed in English and submitted in A4 size.

Note 5: Submitted documents and application fee will not be returned.

Note 6: Incomplete documents or documents arriving after the deadline will not be accepted.

5-4. Selection and Notification of Acceptance

(1) SECAAP will evaluate the applications based on the interview (including online interviews) and the submitted documents.

(2) Notification of admission will be given to applicants around mid-June 2026.

In accordance with the decision made by MEXT.

5-5. Suspension of Payment of Scholarship

Payment of the scholarship will be cancelled for the reasons given below. Should any of the following reasons apply, the grantee may be ordered to return a part of, or all the scholarship paid up to that time. Payment of the scholarship may also be stopped during the period up to the decision on the disposition of the matter.

(1) A grantee is determined to have made a false statement on his/her application;

(2) A grantee violates any article of his/her pledge to the Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology;

(3) A grantee violates any Japanese laws and is sentenced and imprisoned for an indefinite period or for a period exceeding 1 year;

(4) A grantee is suspended from his/her university or receives other punishment, or is removed from enrollment; as a disciplinary action in accordance with school regulations of the accepting institution;

(5) It has been determined that it will be impossible for a grantee to complete the course within the standard period of study because of poor academic grades or suspension or absence from the university;

(6) A grantee came to Japan without newly acquiring the "Student" residence status, or changed his/her residence status to one other than "Student." In case of domestic recommenders, they begin studies as Japanese Government (MEXT) Scholarship students with a status of residence other than "Student" or changed his/her residence status to one other than "Student."

(7) A grantee has received another scholarship (a scholarship or fellowship from Japanese government, a Japanese government-related organization and others) not approved for acceptance in conjunction with the MEXT Scholarship;

(8) A grantee proceeds to a more advanced level of education without receiving approval for an extension of the period of the scholarship;

(9) A grantee withdraws from his/her university or transfers to another university;

(10) A grantee's annual GPA is below 2.30 or the grading standard set by the university.

5-7. Notes

5-8. Supplementary Information

Successful applicants are advised to learn about Japanese culture and customs, climate, and their selected university before arrival in Japan. Although education and research will be conducted in English, all successful applicants are advised to learn the Japanese language for daily life.

6. General Selection

※ This category includes MEXT scholars other than those selected through the University Recommendation /Special Selection and privately funded international students.

6-1. Qualifications and Conditions

(1) Eligibility: Applicants must meet one of the qualifications below:

- 1) Have graduated or will graduate from a Japanese university, or have academic ability equal to or superior to that of a university graduate.
- 2) Have completed or will complete a 16-year school curriculum in a foreign country.
- 3) Have completed a 15-year school curriculum in a foreign country and have been recognized by SECAAP to have obtained the prescribed units with first-class honors.

(2) Citizenship: Applicants must hold citizenship of countries in Asia, Africa, and the Pacific Rim (including the Russian Federation), which have diplomatic relations with the Japanese government or hold Japanese citizenship.

(3) Age: There is no age restriction, as long as the academic requirements are fulfilled.

(4) Health: Applicants must be sufficiently physically and mentally healthy to pursue study at the university.

(5) Language: Applicants must be proficient in English. CEFR: B1 level or above

(6) Visa Requirement: If selected, applicants, excluding Japanese citizens, will be required to acquire a “Student (*ryuugaku*)” visa prior to coming to Japan.

Note 1: Military personnel and civilian employees of armed forces are not eligible.

Note 2: Applicants that do not arrive in Japan by the designated date will be ineligible for admission.

Note 3: If applicants should apply as a prospective university graduate and fail to graduate from their university by September 2026, their enrollment shall be cancelled.

6-2. Application Procedure

Applicants must select one of the three universities and submit the following documents to the Dean of the Graduate School by April 24, 2026.

(1) Application form: (use the provided form).

(2) Field of study and study program (use provided form).

(3) A copy of the certificate of graduation (undergraduate school, and graduate school if applicable) issued by the university authority or an official form indicating that the applicant is expected to graduate and the date of expected graduation.

(4) A copy of the applicant’s academic record (undergraduate school and graduate school) issued by the university authority, indicating a GPA or other evaluation method enabling calculation of an academic performance coefficient.

If possible, a document issued by the undergraduate school attended indicating the applicant's academic record, including his/her class standing, i.e., within the top 5% of the class.

(5) A copy of the applicant’s passport (If you do not have a passport, we accept a certificate of citizenship issued by municipal or appropriate authorities.

(6) Three 4.5×3.5 cm photographs taken within 6 months of submission of the application: hatless, showing the full face and upper torso, applicant’s name and citizenship written on the reverse side. One photograph must be pasted to the application form as indicated.

(7) An abstract of the applicant’s graduation thesis or equivalent (less than 5 pages, A4 size). If applicants are not required by their university to write a graduation thesis, this should be explained. Any publications should be submitted.

(8) The original or certified copy of the results of an internationally recognized English language proficiency test such as TOEFL, TOEIC, or IELTS.

※JICA program candidates may submit a letter issued by their organization or their previous or current academic supervisor in lieu of a certificate of English proficiency.

(9) A letter of recommendation from the applicant's supervisor or equivalent, regarding the applicant's ability and career. The letter of recommendation should also include an evaluation of the applicant's English language proficiency, ranked as "excellent" or "good" (use the provided form).

(10) A record of contact with the prospective academic advisor, which indicates the applicant's choice of academic advisor (use provided form).

(11) Application fee: 30,000 yen.

※MEXT scholars are not required to pay the application fee.

※Applicants to Ehime University through pre-arrival admission that live overseas are not required to pay the application fee.

Note 1: All applicants are required to be in close contact with the prospective academic advisor of their choice, and the research proposal must be prepared in consultation with the prospective advisor.

Note 2: For documents not written in English or Japanese, an official English translation of the certificate must be submitted.

Note 3: Applicants must take interviews with their preferred primary advisor and other faculty members. (Interviews may be conducted online.)

Note 4: All forms should be typed in English and submitted in A4 size.

6-3. Selection and Notification of Acceptance

SECAAP will evaluate the applications based on the interview (including online interviews) and the submitted documents. Successful applicants will be notified by mid-June 2026.

6-4. Tuition and Fees

(1) Entrance fee: 282,000 yen

(2) Tuition fee: 535,800 yen (one year)

If the fees change during the time of attendance, fees will be charged according to the new fee structure.

※MEXT scholars are not required to pay the entrance and tuition fees.

6-5. Conditions for Cancellation

Students may be withdrawn from the program if:

(1) There are errors, misinformation, or falsified documents or materials in the application.

(2) The student does not uphold the pledge of conduct.

(3) The student violates school regulations or has not performed to the satisfaction of the graduate school.

＜アドミッションポリシー＞
